Creating a wordcloud in a literature lesson

William Shakespeare - Romeo and Juliet

In this task, you will work with a tool allowing you to create a worldcloud, which is a useful way to **visualize language data**. You will be working with a given text (see below).

The steps are as follows:

- 1. Go to wordart.com and sign in using either a Facebook or Google account.
- 2. Click CREATE NOW on the main page.
- 3. Follow your teacher's instructions on the board in front of you.
- 4. Copy and paste the following text, which is the Prologue from Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet*:

Two households, both alike in dignity,
In fair Verona, where we lay our scene,
From ancient grudge break to new mutiny,
Where civil blood makes civil hands unclean.
From forth the fatal loins of these two foes
A pair of star-cross'd lovers take their life;
Whose misadventured piteous overthrows
Do with their death bury their parents' strife.
The fearful passage of their death-mark'd love,
And the continuance of their parents' rage,
Which, but their children's end, nought could remove,
Is now the two hours' traffic of our stage;
The which if you with patient ears attend,
What here shall miss, our toil shall strive to mend.

- 5. Based on the visualization you rendered, what can we say about the play without even reading it?
- 6. Name the theme and motifs of the play.
- 7. Which words are shown as the biggest and why? How does it correlate with question no. 6?
